## Moving Ahead

The MOSAIC Moving Ahead program uses a collaborative case-management service approach to deliver comprehensive, holistic, client-centered programming to immigrants and refugees who face multiple barriers to their settlement.

The program provides services to support isolated newcomer populations through community outreach efforts and in-home consultations. Services include the following:

- Individual case management
- · Needs assessment and action planning
- Settlement counselling and information
- Social and emotional support
- Life skills, literacy, and essential skills development workshops
- Job readiness workshops
- Practical assistance
- Supported access to services
- FreeRunning: specialized youth and young adult services

## Eligibility

The Moving Ahead program welcomes refugees and immigrants who:

- Lack Canadian life experience or knowledge of Canadian norms
- Are experiencing complex life situations
- Are struggling with defined hardships and difficulties

\*Applicants are required to take part in an assessment to determine their eligibility for the Moving Ahead program. Those who do not meet the necessary eligibility criteria will be referred to alternate and appropriate community services.

FreeRunning is the youth-focused program under the Moving Ahead umbrella, open to youth and young adults between the ages of 16-28 years old.

The FreeRunning program follows the principles of client-centered case management, serving immigrants and refugees facing multiple barriers during their settlement journey. FreeRunning empowers youth and young adults to connect and grow with an approach that is engaging and flexible.

Youth and young adults facing settlement difficulties are assisted and supported through:

- Specialized case management
- Group information sessions on topics relevant to immigrant and refugee youth
- Job readiness workshops and job-search assistance
- Social events and activities
- Connections to the community and other youth
- Leadership skills training
