WHAT IS WOVEN FUTURES?

Woven Futures is a community-based, collaborative art and storytelling project that invited 9 newcomer, immigrant, and refugee students from New Westminster Secondary School (NWSS) to explore their migration stories, identities, belonging, and future possibilities. CREATIVE PROCESS & INSPIRATION



Rooted in Person-Centered Planning and inspired by global visual traditions, the project centered student voices through a combination of storytelling, guided art activities, and one-on-one mentorship. Participants created handmade paper using photocopies of personal and family immigration documents, which became the foundation for a collective mural.

Through techniques such as paper making, layering, and mixed media, students expressed both the weight of their past and hope for the future. The final artwork draws on rich cultural influences, including Mexican papel picado, Chinese cut paper, Islamic geometric patterns, and Japanese washi paper-blending these diverse traditions into a shared visual language of resilience, memory, migration, and meaning.
